CODE OF CONDUCT

Attendance at Alabama CTE Leadership Council (Alabama CTSO) events, including the Academy for Chapter Excellence (ACE) and/or Joint Leadership Development Conference (JLDC), is a privilege. The following conduct policies will apply to all delegates: students, advisors, and any other authorized persons attending the activity. This form must be signed by each student (under 21) attending Alabama CTSO events and submitted to the chapter advisor/teacher prior to the conference. The chapter advisor/teacher must have a completed copy of the permission/participant form for each student attending in their possession for the duration of the event, including travel to and from the event. This form must be kept on file in the local school district after the conference.

Delegates shall abide by the rules and practices of both the *Alabama CTE Leadership Council (Alabama CTSO) and their local school district policies,* at all times to, during, and from the designated point of origin of the activity. Delegates shall respect and abide by the authority vested in the Alabama State Department of Education (ALSDE) and the Alabama CTE Leadership Council (Alabama CTSO). The standards outlined in this document constitute the Alabama CTSO Code of Conduct.

The following shall be regarded as severe violations of the Code of Conduct:

Should a conduct code violation occur for item one (1) through six (6) below, regardless of when exposed, the violating student(s) **will** be sent home. If the violation warrants it, law enforcement may also be notified. Determination of penalties for violations will be at the discretion of the ALSDE/Alabama CTSO Planning Team.

- 1. Alcohol, Drugs and Tobacco: a student shall not possess, use, transmit, be under the influence of, or show evidence of having used an alcoholic beverage, other drugs, substances or tobacco products capable of or intended, purported, or presumed to be capable of altering a student's mood, perception, behavior or judgment; other than properly used, over-the-counter pain relievers and medications prescribed by a physician for an individual student and must be on record with the advisor. Nor shall the student possess, use, sell or transmit paraphernalia associated with drugs, alcohol, or chemical substance in any form (including tobacco), at any time, or under any circumstances, on public or private properties.
- **2. Curfew (when applicable)**: Committing serious violations of curfew regulations as outlined in item eight (8) below.
- **3. Willful Companionship:** Being in the willful companionship of someone who violates any portion of the conduct code or failing to report any direct knowledge (other than hearsay) of the conduct code violations.
- **4. Personal Conduct:** Cheating, dishonesty, or taking unfair advantage of others; participating in social activities other than those with conference participants; conducting acts and/or possession of weapons capable of causing bodily harm or fear of life, defacing or stealing any public or private property (for which financial responsibility will rest solely with offending individuals or their chapter/school); breaking the law; other serious violations of personal conduct regulations.
- **5. Serious Violations** of the student conduct code of the school district or school that the student represents.

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6. Abusive Behavior and Lewd Conduct: A student shall not engage in any lewd, indecent, sexual, or obscene act or expression or possess such materials. A student shall not engage in verbal, physical or sexual harassment, hazing, or name-calling. The use of slurs against any person on the basis of race, color, creed, national origin, ancestry, age, sex, sexual orientation, or disability is prohibited.

The following shall be other violations of the Code of Conduct:

Should a conduct code violation occur for items seven (7) to eleven (11) below, regardless of when exposed, the violating student(s) **may** be sent home. Determination of penalties for violations will be at the discretion of the ALSDE/Alabama CTSO Planning Team or local advisor/teacher.

- **7. Conference Conduct**: Failing to wear the supplied conference wristband (if provided) at all times from arrival at the conference until departure at the end of the conference; leaving sessions prior to their conclusion (except in the case of emergency); failing to attend all general sessions and assigned activities for which a delegate is registered; not abiding by the rules and regulations of the event, or school/district policies from the time he/she leave their home or school for any activity and the time he/she returns to the same home or school following the activity.
- **8. Curfew (when applicable):** Failing to be in your assigned hotel room from the curfew time designated in the conference schedule until 6 a.m.; causing any noise or other disturbance audible by anyone in the hallway after designated curfew time; ordering any food after the designated curfew time; causing any other unnecessary disturbance or participating in any other inappropriate activity after the designated curfew time.
- **9. Dress**: Failing to abide by the dress regulations established for the conference, as outlined in the Dress Code.
- **10. Personal Conduct**: Failing to report accidents, injuries or illnesses immediately to the local Advisor; failing to keep adult advisors informed of activities and whereabouts at all times; using tobacco products outside of local school district policies and state law; having a member of the opposite sex in a room if no adult chaperone is present and the room door is not visibly open (e.g. the door may be propped wide open); having a delegate or advisor of the opposite sex in a room without a third person present and the door visibly open.
- **11. Venue/Housing Conduct:** Failing to meet the professional standards of venue/housing facilities; accruing incidental room charges (i.e., phone calls, room service, pay-per-view movies, etc.) without settling the account prior to check-out; throwing objects out the window or into the hallway; moving furniture from rooms/spaces (e.g., onto the balcony); failing to follow venue/hotel rules and regulations.

Individual School District Policies may supersede the code of conduct.

DRESS CODE FOR DELEGATES ATTENDING ACE AND/OR JLDC

The following guidelines have been developed to clarify the dress code used at Alabama CTSO events.

- Collared shirt with slacks and appropriate shoes, or
- dress blouse with either slacks or skirts (appropriate length) and appropriate shoes.

Inappropriate Dress: Tank tops, mid-riff tops, t-shirt with suggestive words or pictures, denim pants or skirts, mini-skirts, shorts, overalls, tennis shoes, sandals, and/or mules.
